It's getting pretty close to the end of the season. Every team has played each other a couple of times and the Under 11 Dockers have worked out who are the teams to beat when it comes to finals. This week the boys were travelling to play top of the table Hornsby at Rofe Park. The Dockers haven't beaten Hornsby this year but Coach Darren wanted to give the boys a



very simple message before the start of the game. This week was not about goals, points or margins. It was about effort. Forget the season so far. Draw a line in the sand and from here on every boy gives 100% for the team. The boys' eyes were fixed on Darren as he said: "At the end of the game, I am going to ask each boy to tell the rest of the team whether they had played their best game or not".



Clearly the message got through from the start with the Dockers thrusting forward from the opening bounce. It was high paced, high powered footy that left Hornsby initially stunned. They were not used to not being in control of the game and were shell shocked by the ferocity of the Dockers at the contest. It was tight close footy, just the way the Dockers like it, as each team traded shots at goal. It

After the wash out last week-end, the Dockers were greeted by a calm and pleasant sunny morning at Jubilee Oval. Facing the Glebe Greyhounds (top of ladder) was going to be a tough task!
